LAST WILL & TESTAMENT OF RALPH EASTLAND

STATE OF OKLAHOMA :

SS: LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF RALPH EASTLAND.

COUNTY OF CHOCTAW

I, Ralph Eastland, of the city of Hugo, in the county of Choctaw, in the State of Oklahoma, being of sound mind and memory, and desiring to make disposition of my property, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other or former Wills by me at any time made.

I.

I direct the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses.

II.

In making this Will I have in mind the pre-nuptial property agreement had and entered into between my present wife, Bertha Eastland, and myself, and this Will is made in contemplation and in accordance with said agreement, and this Will shall be subservient to said anti-nuptial agreement.

Which said agreement is in words and figures, as follows, to wit:

“Anti-Nuptial Contract.

This agreement made and entered this the 23rd day of March, 1942, between Ralph Eastland, of Choctaw County, Oklahoma, party of the first part, and Bertha Napier, Topeka, of Shawnee County, State of Kansas, party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said parties mutually promise to intermarry; that the said Ralph Eastland is a widower, having a grown son by this former wife, and owns property accumulated by the joint efforts of himself and his deceased wife. That the party of the second part is a single woman, over the age of 21.

Now for the arranging of all rights of property, said parties agree, as follows: That all of the property owned by the said Ralph Eastland shall remain and be his sole and separate property, and that upon the death of either of the said parties, the said property owned by either of them at the time of said death, shall descend to their present heirs, and neither of the said parties shall inherit from the other, save and except as to such property as shall have been accumulated by their joint efforts during their married life, and such property so accumulated, one half of said property shall be inherited by the survivor.

It is further agreed and understood that in case the said party of the second part shall by the survivor, that she shall have during her life time the rental income from Lot (1) One in Block 94, Lot 3 (3) in Block 94 and Lot 6, (6) in Block 105, in the city of Hugo, and the owner in fee shall pay the insurance and taxes, so that the rental income from said property shall be net to the party of the second part, subject only to the expenses of up keep; and all other property of the said Ralph Eastland, at the time of said marriage, and owned by him at the time of his marriage, together with one half of all other property accumulated by the said parties during their martial relation shall go to his said son, free from any claim of the said party of the second part.

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It is further agreed that if the said party of the second part shall pre-decease the said Ralph Eastland, or in case of a divorce between the said parties as a result of the fault of the said wife then in case of the happening of either of said events, neither she nor her heirs, shall be entitled to the rental income hereinbefore mentioned, or to one-half of the property jointly accumulated by said parties.

This agreement is made before and in consideration of the said proposed marriage and the purpose of this agreement is to settle the property rights of the parties before their marriage, so the entering into the marriage relation between the said parties will not give to the said party of the second part, any property rights, save and except the rights to the rental income of the property hereinbefore described, and to the property jointly accumulated by said parties, in accordance with the conditions of this contract; and both or the parties hereby accept said contract freely and without restraint after having fully informed themselves of its meaning and contents.

III.

I give and devise and bequeath to my beloved wife, Bertha Eastland, all the property as set forth and expressed in said anti-nuptial agreement, and in accordance with the term thereof, and no other property of any kind or character, belonging to me at the time of my death, except as specifically set forth in said anti-nuptial agreement.

IV.

I give and devise and bequeath to my son, Joseph Milton Eastland, all of my property of every kind and character, both real, personal, and mixed, wherever situated, which would not be antagonistic or in opposition to the anti-nuptial agreement hereinbefore set forth and mentioned.

V.

For the purpose of effectuating the division of my property in accordance with the terms of this my last will and testament, and in order that my business affairs be speedily wound up after my death, I direct as my Executor, hereinafter designated, and appointed, shall have full power and authority to sell and dispose of any and all of my

property and efforts, without order of the court, in such manner and upon such terms, as to him shall seem more advantageous. And I will and direct, that for the purpose of winding up my business and disposing of my property, my executor shall have full power and authority to take charge of any and all of my said property, wherever situated and located, and to manage the same as far as may be necessary in winding up my said business, or in carrying out existing contracts relative thereto; and to collect indebtedness owing to me, and to convert my personal assets into money or other personal property, and to divide the proceeds arising from such sales between the devisees and legatees under this Will, and in accordance with the terms thereof. And after the payment of all my just debts legally chargeable against my estate, the cost of administration, etc., that there shall be turned over to my said wife, Bertha Eastland, the said property named in the said anti-nuptial agreement set forth herein and mentioned above, to be handled by her and to her use and benefit, in accordance with the said agreement, and in order that she may collect the rents and profits therefrom, and in accordance with this Will. And Shall also turn over to her her portion of the property acquired after the marriage of the said Ralph Eastland and the said Bertha Eastland.

That all the rest, residue and remainder of my said property, of every kind and character, wherever situated, shall belong to and be the separate property of my son, Joseph Milton Eastland.

VI.

I hereby designate and appoint my son, Joseph Milton Eastland, as Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, and direct that he not be required to give bond as such executor, either in the exercise of general powers or in case of sale of property under order of court or pursuant to powers expressed in this Will.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, Ralph Eastland, have to this my Last Will and Testament, consisting of four sheets of paper, subscribed my name this the 9th day of August, 1945.

FINAL DECREE IN THE ESTATE OF RALPH EASTLAND

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF CHOCTAW COUNTY, OKLAHOMA

FINAL DECREE

Now, on the 2nd day of December, 1947, there comes on for hearing in its regular order the final account of Joseph Milton Eastland, executor of the estate of the said Ralph Eastland, deceased, and his petition for the distribution of the said estate and for his discharge as executor thereof; the said Joseph Milton Eastland appearing in person before this court and also being represented by his attorneys, Welch, Bounds, and Kile, and there also appearing before this court Bertha Eastland, who is represented by her attorney, D. A. Stovall, whereupon the court proceeds to examine the notice given of the pendency of this hearing and finds that the said notice was given in due form and in the manner and time required by law; whereupon, the court proceeds to examine the evidence offered and is of the opinion and doth find:

That the necessary expenses of the funeral and the last sickness of the said deceased and of this administration have been fully paid and that all the debts existing against the said deceased or allowed by the court pursuant to law, have been fully paid and satisfied and that the said estate has been fully administered as shown by the final account of the said Joseph Milton Eastland, executor of said estate, which said account has been duly audited and allowed by this court.

That said Ralph Eastland died testate and that the residue of the said estate consists of the following described property, to-wit:

Cash in the sum of \$835.86

Ten (10) shares of stock of the Citizens State Bank of Hugo, Oklahoma

Lot 1 and the east 10 feet of Lot 2 and the west 40 feet of Lot 3 all being in Block 94 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma and Lot 6 of Block 105 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma.

A one-sixteenth (1/16) interest in and to the mineral rights in the W1/2 of the SE1/4 and the S1/2 of the SW1/4 of

NE1/4 of the SW1/4 and the S1/2 of the SW1/4 all in Section 29, Township 6 South, Range 20 East of the I.B.M. and the W1/2 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 of the SE1/4 and the E1/2 of the E1/2 all in Section 31, Township 6 South, Range 20 East of the I.B.M. and the NW1/4 and the N1/2 of the NE1/4 of the SW1/4 and the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 of Section 32, Township 6 South, Range 20 East of the I.B.M. and a one-seventeenth (17) interest in all of the gas, oil, and other minerals in the W1/2 of the E1/2 of the NW1/4 and the W1/2 of the NE1/4 of the SW1/4 and the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 and the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 and the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 all in Section 32, Township 5 South, Range 8 East of the I.B.M.

And if further appearing to the court that all state inheritance taxes and transfer taxes have been paid and the receipts therefore duly submitted to this court.

And it further appearing to the court that the said estate is not of sufficient size for Federal inheritance tax or transfer tax to be paid and that, therefore, the payment of such taxes is not necessary; and it further appearing to the court that under and by the terms of the last will and testament of the said Ralph Eastland, deceased, the said Bertha Eastland, as a surviving widow, is entitled to take one-half (1/2) of the property acquired during her coverture with the said decedent and through their joint effort, and the rental income from Lot 1 and the east ten (10) feet of Lot 2 and the west forty (40) feet of Lot 3 of Block 94 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma, and Lot 6 of Block 105 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma.

And it further appearing to the court that the property acquired by the said Ralph Eastland, deceased and Bertha Eastland during their coverture and through their joint effort is the cash now remaining on hand with the said executor herein, and ten shares of the stock of the Citizens State Bank of Hugo, Oklahoma; that the said Bertha Eastland is therefore entitled to and should receive as her distributive share of the estate of the said Ralph Eastland, deceased, the sum of \$355.18, five shares of stock of the Citizens State Bank of Hugo, Oklahoma and the rental income from the said real property.

The court further finds that there has been duly made and entered herein a proper order directing the said executor to pay all of the rentals from said realty accruing since the death of the said Ralph Eastland to the said Bertha Eastland and that the same have been duly paid pursuant to said order.

And it further appearing to the court that under and by the terms of the said last will and testament of the said Ralph Eastland, deceased, the said Joseph Milton Eastland is entitled to take all of the rest and residue of the estate of the said Ralph Eastland, deceased, as his distributive share thereof, which said rest and residue consists of the following described property, to-wit: cash, in the sum of \$355.18; five shares of the common stock of the Citizens State Bank; Lot 1 and the east ten feet of Lot 2 and the west forty feet of Lot 3 all being in Block 94 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma, and Lot 6 of Block 105 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma subject to the right of the said Bertha Eastland to receive the entire rentals therefrom for and during the remainder of her life, provided that the insurance and taxes on said real property shall be paid by the said Joseph Milton Eastland and/or his successors and assigns for and during the lifetime of the said Bertha Eastland, and

a one-sixteenth (1/16) interest in and to the mineral rights in the W1/2 of the SE1/4 and the S1/2 of the SW1/4 of Section 33, Township 1 South, Range 7 West of the I.B.M. and a one-fourth (1/4) interest in the mineral rights in and to the NE1/4 of the NE1/4 of the SW1/4 and the S1/2 of the N1/2 of the SW1/4 and the S1/2 and the SW1/4 all in Section 29, Township 6 South, Range 20 East of the I.B.M. and the W1/2 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 of the SE1/4 and the E1/2 of the E1/2 all in Section 31, Township 6 South, Range 20 East of the I.B.M. and the NW1/4 and the N1/2 of the NE1/4 of the SW1/4 and the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 of Section 32, Township 6 South, Range 20 East of the I.B.M. and a one-seventeenth (17) interest in all of the gas, oil, and other minerals in the W1/2 of the E1/2 of the NW1/4 and the W1/2 of the NE1/4 of the SW1/4 and the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 and the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 and the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 all in Section 32, Township 5 South, Range 8 East of the I.B.M.

It is ordered, considered, adjudged and decreed by the court that Joseph Milton Eastland, who is hereby found and declared to be one and the same person as J. M. Eastland, and Bertha Eastland are the sole and only heirs of Ralph Eastland, deceased, and the above described shares of said estate of Ralph Eastland, deceased, so, as aforesaid, set opposite the names of said heirs respectively be and the same are hereby transferred, vested, assigned, and conveyed to the said heirs as follows: To the said Bertha Eastland the sum of \$355.18 in cash, 5 shares of the stock of the Citizens State Bank of Hugo, Oklahoma and the entire rentals from Lot 1 and the east ten feet of Lot 2 and the west forty feet of Lot 3, all being in Block 94 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma, and Lot 6 of Block 105 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma for and during the remainder of her life.

To the said Joseph Milton Eastland, who is also known and declared to be one and the same person as J. M. Eastland, \$355.18 in cash; 5 shares of the stock of the Citizens State Bank of Hugo, Oklahoma and the following described real property, to wit: Lot 1 and the east ten feet of Lot 2 and the west forty feet of Lot 3 all being in Block 94 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma, and Lot 6 of Block 105 of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma subject to the right of the said Bertha Eastland to receive the entire rentals therefrom for and during the remainder of her life, provided that the insurance and taxes on said real property shall be paid by the said Joseph Milton Eastland and/or his successors and assigns for and during the lifetime of the said Bertha Eastland, and should it become necessary for the said Bertha Eastland to pay such taxes and insurance to protect her interests therein such payments shall constitute a lien on said realty.

To have and to hold the same together with and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances to the above named persons and heirs and assigns forever.

It is further ordered, considered, adjudged, and decreed by the court that the Citizens State Bank of Hugo, Oklahoma shall, upon the receipt of a duly certified copy of this order, make such transfers of the stock of the said bank as might be necessary to effect the execution of this decree as hereinabove provided.

FINAL DECREE IN THE ESTATE OF CARRIE PAULINE EASTLAND

FINAL DECREE

It appearing to the court, on satisfactory proofs and the evidence, that the necessary expenses of the funeral and the last sickness of the said deceased, and of the administration of said estate, having been fully paid, and that all the debts existing against said deceased, or allowed by the court, pursuant to law, have been fully paid and satisfied, and that said estate has been fully administered, as shown by the final account of Joseph Milton Eastland, administrator of the said estate, duly audited and allowed by the court, pursuant to due notice given and served, reference being had thereto, and that said estate is ready for distribution.

And it further appearing, that due notice of the application for this final decree in said matter assigning the estate to the persons thereto entitled by law, has likewise been duly given and served pursuant to the law in such case made and now provided.

And it further appearing to the court that the said deceased died intestate and that the residue of said estate consists of the following described property, to-wit:

Lot one (1) of block ninety four (94) of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma,
the same being of the appraised value of \$4,000.00

One 1937 model two-door Pontiac sedan automobile the same being of the
appraised value of \$400.00.

The court further finds that the State of Oklahoma ex rel the Oklahoma Tax Commission has filed herein its order dated the 14th day of April, 1947, exempting the said estate from the payment of estate and inheritance taxes.

The court further finds that the said estate is not of sufficient size for federal inheritance tax or transfer tax to paid and that the payment of such federal inheritance tax or transfer tax is not necessary.

The court further finds that the said Carrie Pauline Eastland, deceased, left as her sole and only heirs at law her surviving husband, Ralph Eastland, and one son, Joseph Milton Eastland.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, CONSIDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT that Ralph Eastland and Joseph Milton Eastland are the sole and only heirs at law of Carrie Pauline Eastland, deceased, and there is hereby transferred, vested, assigned and conveyed to each of the said heirs an undivided one-half interest in and to the following described real and personal property to-wit:

Lot one (1) block ninety four (94) of the original townsite of Hugo, Oklahoma


One 1937 model two-door Pontiac sedan automobile of the appraised value of \$400.00

Pushmataha (*Apushim-ahltaha*, 'the sapling is ready, or finished, for him.' Halvert).

A noted Choctaw, of unknown ancestry, born on the east bank of Noxuba Creek in Noxubee County, Mississippi in 1764; died at Washington D.C., Dec 24, 1824. before he was 20 years of age he distinguished himself in an expedition against the Osage, west of the Mississippi. The boy disappeared early in a conflict that lasted all day, and on rejoining the Choctaw warriors was jeered at and accused of cowardice, whereon Pushmataha replied "Let those laugh who can show more scalps than I can," forthwith producing five scalps, which he threw upon the ground the result of a single-handed onslaught on the enemy's rear. This incident gained for him the name "Eagle" and won for him a chieftaincy; later he became *mingo* of the Oklahannali or Six Towns district of the Choctaw, and exercised much influence in promoting friendly relations with the whites. Although generally victorious, Pushmataha's war party on one occasion was attacked by a number of Cherokee and defeated. He is said to have moved into the present Texas, then Spanish territory, where he lived several years, adding to his reputation for prowess, on one occasion going alone at night to a Tonaqua (Tawakoni?) village, killing seven men with his own hand, and setting fire to several houses. During the next two years he made three more expeditions against the same people, adding eight scalps to his trophies. When [Tecumseh](#) visited the Choctaw in 1811 to persuade them to join in an uprising against the Americans, Pushmataha strongly opposed the movement, and it was largely through his influence that the Shawnee chief's mission among this tribe failed. During the War of 1812 most of the Choctaw became friendly to the United States through the opposition of Pushmataha and John Pitchlynn to a neutral course, Pushmataha being alleged to have said, on the last day of a ten days' council: "The Creeks were once our friends. They have joined the English and we must now follow different trails. When our fathers took the hand of Washington, they told him the Choctaw would always be friends of his nation, and Pushmataha can not be false to their promises. I am now ready to fight against both the English and the Creeks." He was at the head of 500 warriors during the war, engaging in 24 fights and serving under Jackson's eye in the Pensacola campaign. In 1813, with about 150 Choctaw warriors, he joined Gen. Claiborne and distinguished himself in the attack and defeat of the Creeks under Weatherford at Kantchati, or Holy Ground, on Alabama River, Ala.

While aiding the United States troops he was so rigid in his discipline that he soon succeeded in converting his wild warriors into efficient soldiers, while for his energy in fighting the Creeks and Seminole he became popularly known to the whites as "The Indian General."

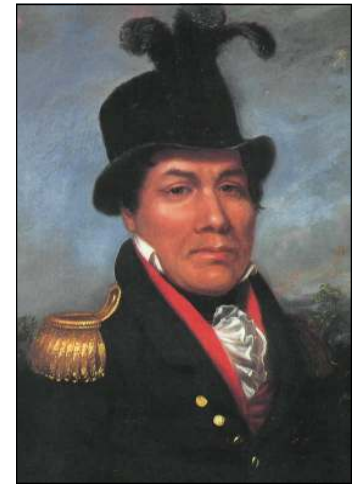
Pushmataha signed the treaties of Nov. 16, 1805; Oct. 24, 1816; and Oct. 18, 1820. In negotiating the last treaty, at Doak's Stand, "he displayed much diplomacy and showed a business capacity equal to that of Gen. Jackson, against whom he was pitted, in driving a sharp bargain." In 1824 he went to Washington to negotiate another treaty in behalf of his tribe. Following a brief visit to Lafayette, then at the capital, Pushmataha became ill and died within 24 hours. In accordance with his request he was buried with military honors, a procession of 2,000 persons, military and civilian, accompanied by President Jackson, following his remains to Congressional Cemetery. A shaft bearing the following inscriptions was erected over his grave: "Pushmataha a Choctaw chief lies here. This monument to his memory is erected by his brother chiefs who were associated with him in a delegation from their nation, in the year 1824, to the General Government of the United States." "Push-ma-taha was a warrior of great distinction. He was wise in council, eloquent in an extraordinary degree, and on all occasions, and under all circumstances, the white man's friend." "He died in Washington, on the 24th of December, 1824, of the croup, in the 60th year of his age." General Jackson frequently expressed the opinion that Pushmataha was the greatest and the bravest Indian he had ever known, and John Randolph of Roanoke, in pronouncing a eulogy on him in the Senate, uttered the words regarding his wisdom, his eloquence, and his friendship for the whites that afterward were inscribed on his monument. There is good reason to believe, however, that much of Pushmataha's reputation for eloquence was due in no small part to his interpreters. He was deeply interested in the education of his people, and it is said devoted \$2,000 of his annuity for fifteen years toward the support of the Choctaw school system. As *mingo* of the Oklahannali, Pushmataha was succeeded by Nittakechi, "Day-prolonger." Several portraits of Pushmataha are extant, including one in the Redwood Library at Newport, R. I., one in possession of Gov. McCurtain at Kinta, Okla. (which was formerly in the Choctaw capitol), and another in a Washington restaurant. The first portrait, painted by C. B. King at Washington in 1824, shortly before Pushmataha's death, was burned in the Smithsonian fire of 1865.

Pushmataha was born in east Mississippi in 1765, but his dominion embraced our southwestern counties. The name Pushmataha means "He has won all the honors of his race." Or all the Indians of pure blood who have a place in American history, he blended more admirable traits in his character than any other. He was intelligent, affable, sagacious, brave, eloquent, witty, and comparatively temperate, and, like Logan, he was truly the friend of the white man.' When told of the massacre at Fort Mimes, he rode to Mobile, in company with Mr. Geo. S. Gaines, and offered his services and those of his tribe to Gen. Flournoy. And when they were accepted, he led a body of his warriors with the expedition of Gen. Claiborne the attack on Econochaca. While on his way to Washington, the last time, he rode through Demopolis, and there asked Col. G. S. Gaines to furnish his nephew with a keg of gunpowder, in the event of his death, so that suitable honors might be paid to his memory as a chief and a warrior. He died in Washington a few weeks later. Gen. Jackson visited him in his illness, and he was buried in the congressional cemetery with military honors. The tablet on his monument bears this inscription :

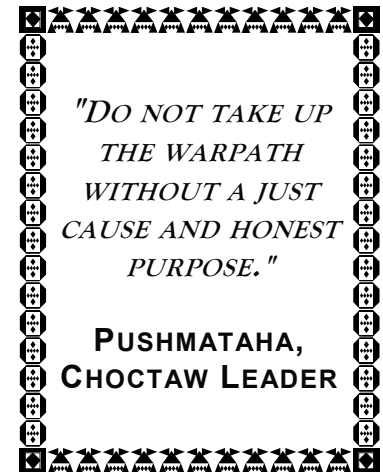
Pushmataha, a Choctaw chief, lies here. This monument is erected by his brother chiefs, who were associated with him in a delegation from their nation, in the year 1824, to the general assembly of the United States. He died in Washington, Dec. 24, 1824, of the croup, in the 60th year of his age. Pushmataha was a warrior of great distinction. He was wise in council, eloquent in an extraordinary degree, and, on all occasions, and under all circumstances, the white-man's friend. Among his last words were this following: 'When I am gone let the big guns be fired over me.' He said that his death would be like the falling of a great tree in the forest when the winds were still.
