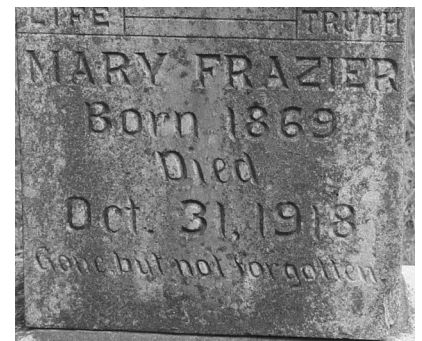

Rev. Firebaugh was called last Friday to conduct the funeral of Mrs. J. Frazier, who died of pneumonia. Mrs. Frazier was a fullblood Indian, and spoke both English and Choctaw. She was president of the Presbyterian of Indian Presbytery and filled the office well. She will be greatly missed by her friends.

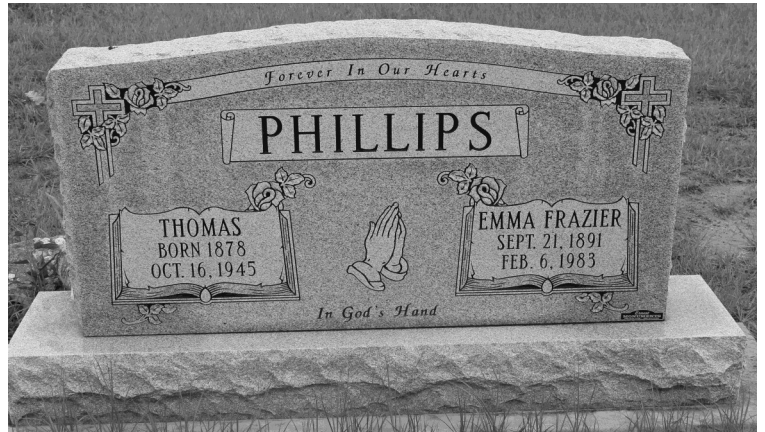

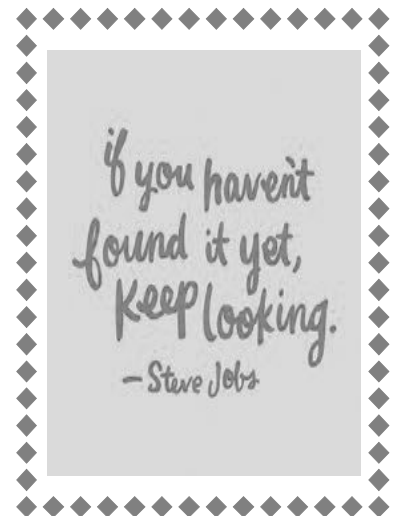
