

**Fort Towson's Representative Town Builders  
Not Boomers, But Wide Awake Citizens  
Who are in Line for Progress and Prosperity**

The subject of this sketch is one of the pioneers of Fort Towson, having removed here July 1st, 1902, and erected one of the first substantial dwellings. He is a native of Tipper county, Miss., but removed with his parents when 7 years old to Lamar county, Texas, where a few years later he began the study of medicine and chose this profession as his avocation in life. He resided 10 miles northeast of Paris at Faught, which place was named in honor of him and practiced medicine there successfully. In May 1903, he built a store room in Fort Towson, in which he now carries a neat and up-to-date stock of drugs.

The doctor is one of the town's foremost citizens, and while a practicing physician, does not miss an opportunity to push the fact before the public that this place is an unusually healthy location. He predicts a phenomenal growth for Fort Towson and believes it is destined to become one of the largest and best business centers in the Choctaw Nation.
