MAN AND WOMAN ARRESTED IN ROOMING HOUSE ON CHARGE OF ADULTRY [sic] BOUND OVER BY COURT

Boy 15 Years' Old Arrested at Same Time on Delinquency Complaint Will Be Sent to Reform School MAN AND WOMAN WED

Husband of Mrs. Grace Gordon Is Star Witness Against Her and Harvey Miller, Alleged Bigamist

Harvey F. Miller, Mrs. Grace Gordon, and Frank Davis, 15 years old, were arrested at a local rooming house yesterday evening by Police Chief M. L. Watson, who subsequently turned the trio over to the authorities of Choctaw County.

Miller and Mrs. Gordon were given a preliminary examination this morning before Justice of the Peace L.W. Oakes, and upon recommendation of County Attorney W.J. Holloway, were each bound over to the District Court in the sum of \$2,000, they being charged with adultery.

County Attorney Holloway filed a delinquency charge against the boy, Frank Davis, before County Judge W.T. Glenn, and he will be sent to the reform school at Paul's Valley.

The arrest of Miller and Mrs. Gordon was requested by M.C. Gordon, a husband of the woman, of Ladonia, who came to Hugo in search of the pair after his wife had suddenly absented herself from his board and keep.

When the man and woman were arrested by Police Chief Watson, Miller quickly produced a marriage license, showing that he and the woman were married at Altus on October 4, 1919, the bride's name being then given as Grace Robertson.

Mr. Gordon of Ladonia claims that he married the woman several years ago, an [sic], according to County Attorney Holloway, if that is true, and it is not doubted, Miller and the woman will be amenable to the authorities in Jackson County on charges of adultery and bigamy.

Mr. Gordon signed the complaints charging Miller and Mrs. Gordon with adultery, and was the star witness against them at the preliminary hearing held this morning.
