

C.R. PAGE HOST TO EMPLOYEES OF LOCAL FORD FIRM

Dinner Given At Webb; Rev. Hicks Speaks to Group

Mr. Page announced to the group that he had recently purchased the agency here and that he would continue to operate it under the firm name of Hugo Motors.

Musical entertainment was provided by the "Oklahoma Green Horns," local string band. The principal address was delivered by Rev. Ernest Hick, pastor of the First Methodist church.

Mr. Page came to Hugo in December as manager of the Hugo Motors agency. Since coming here he has endeavored to build up a feeling of good will among the employes [sic] and toward the public. The firm has over sold its quota of both new and used cars and the dinner last night was in the form of a reward for the employes [sic], Mr. Page stated.
