

Two Negro Women in a Cutting Affray

The Hugo Husonian March 14, 1912 - transcribed by Ron Henson

At 1 p.m. Monday afternoon two negro women, Johnnie Burks and Rose Roebuck, engaged in an affray in darktown with the result that the Roebuck woman is likely to die of her injuries, with the Burks negress in jail, awaiting the outcome of her opponent's injuries before being allowed to offer bail.

Undersheriff Mead Harris took the Burks negress before Justice Schooler, but the condition of the injured Roebuck woman was such that the justice refused bond and the woman was sent to the jail.
